County officials meet with FAA to advance residents' concerns about BWI-Marshall Airport noise

Earlier this month I conducted a meeting with the FAA at their DC office with a contingent of local, state, and federal representatives. We had a constructive meeting discussing the increased noise due to air traffic over Elkridge, Hanover, and Columbia.

I was joined by Council Chair Calvin Ball, Maryland Delegate Eric Ebersole (D12), and representatives for US Senator Ben Cardin, House of Representatives members Sarbanes, Cummings, and Ruppertsberger, County Executive Kittleman, and Delegate Clarence Lam (D12).

A few key outcomes:

- FAA committed to reviewing the near-term improvements recommended by the community and the Maryland Aviation Administration (MAA) and report back to us about their disposition and progress, including interim altitude changes.
- Conduct a meeting by mid-September with MAA, FAA, and our HoCo representatives to coordinate efforts and actions.
- FAA will work with MAA to initiate the formal process for a procedural review with community input.

Proposal could expand Howard County Council's limited budget flexibility

Proposed by Councilman Jon Weinstein and Councilwoman Mary Kay Sigaty, the measure - if passed by the council this month and approved by voters in November - is part of a broader push to give the council greater budget flexibility and transparency. With this authority, the council could move funds it cuts into two additional categories: the county's pension fund and a contingency reserve fund, funds set aside to cover future expenses under certain circumstances.




