 - 8. Support changing Cannabis from a Schedule 1 Drug under the Controlled Substances Act to a lesser Schedule to permit research and support better regulation of the safety and efficacy of the products
- 5. Public health campaigns:
 - a. Consider the benefits of the County partnering with the State to inform the public of health risks and effects
 - 1. Fund local public health responsible use media campaigns to mitigate adverse health related outcomes. Messages should include Safe Storage to prevent Accidental Poisoning; Cannabis Use and Impact on Motor Vehicle Collisions; Cannabis Use and Pregnancy Risk similar to:

- 1. Fund and offer cannabis education and cannabis use disorder training among healthcare providers and trainees

- 4. Support requirement for CEU's/CME's for licensed providers on Cannabis use and misuse
