

DRAFT RECOMMENDATIONS

- Sellers Network
 - Develop an organized system to connect all cannabis sellers to one network
 - Perhaps grant law enforcement access
 - Why: to assist in complying with the law that allows individuals to purchase a certain amount of cannabis product per day
 - Colorado
 - System called “Metrc” - [Metrc Colorado | Official Cannabis Tracking & Compliance](#)
 - Each store can use a different POS system but they all must link to Metrc
- Pamphlets
 - Explain health risks
 - Explain risks of child access
 - Suggestions for keeping out of children’s reach
 - Advise on the law
 - Explain what to do in case of emergencies
 - Hotline numbers
 - Pamphlets to be distributed in cannabis stores and to parents through the school system
 - Why: to educate the public and encourage healthy and safe cannabis use
 - Colorado:
 - An educational resource in the form of an 8×11 paper pamphlet must be provided to customers (medical and recreational) at the point of sale of a concentrate. This pamphlet will include a black dot, smaller than a fingernail, displaying the state's recommended serving size for concentrates.
 - It will also feature advice on how to safely consume and a list of negative conditions the state declares can result from the use of marijuana concentrate, including psychotic symptoms, “uncontrolled and repetitive vomiting” and “physical and psychological dependence.” The pamphlet will list numbers to various hotlines for people experiencing any of those problems.

- Required Education for sellers
 - County-wide mandate for courses in order to work in a cannabis store with required continued education
 - Include a course that teaches employees what questions to ask, what to say, etc.
 - Why: to offer consistency on what information buyers are receiving
 - Colorado:

- Not required to do trainings but they often do them
- When a new product is brought in, representatives will often visit the store to do a sort of presentation so that the employees are aware of the specifics of the product (this is not a requirement)
- Symbol
 - Require all packaging to also contain a symbol
 - Why:
 - parents can teach their children to stay away from anything that has the symbol on it
 - Adults who maybe can't read the packaging could recognize the symbol
