Dear Council Chair Walsh,

Pursuant to Section 13.1600 of the Howard County Code, the Department of Housing and Community Development is authorized to administer the Housing Opportunities Trust Fund ("Fund") in accordance with guidelines established by House Bill 878-2022.

Administered by the Howard County Department of Housing and Community Development, the purpose of the Fund is to promote equitable access to affordable housing for households of limited incomes in Howard County, through the issuance of loans, grants or direct financial assistance to individuals, non-profits, or developers of affordable housing. Authorized uses of the Fund include developing, preserving, and rehabilitating affordable housing units, as well as assisting incomeeligible renters and first-time home buyers.

The Howard County Department of Housing and Community Development is required to report Fund activities of the prior fiscal year to the Howard County Council and the Howard County Delegation to the General Assembly by December 1 of each year. There were no expenditures in FY2023 or FY2024. This is the first annual report.

Housing Opportunities Trust Fund Annual Report FY2024

Housing Opportunities Trust Fund Annual Report – Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2024

Overview

Pursuant to Section 13.1600 of the Howard County Code, the Department of Housing and Community Development is authorized to administer the Housing Opportunities Trust Fund ("Fund") in accordance with guidelines established by House Bill 878-2022.

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A minimum of 50% of the expenditures from the fund in a fiscal year shall benefit households with an annual income of not more than 50% of the Howard County median income. In addition, a minimum of 40% of those expenditures shall benefit households with an annual income of not more than 30% of the Howard County median income.

Establishment of a housing trust fund was a key recommendation in the Housing Opportunities Master Plan completed in April 2021.

Housing Opportunities Trust Fund Advisory Committee

County Executive Ball created the Housing Opportunities Trust Fund Advisory Committee by Executive Order 2023-01. The Committee was created to set funding goals and priorities for the Fund, review applications in response to funding availability and make funding recommendations to the Housing and Community Development Board.

Budget Appropriations

Fiscal Year 2023, \$5,000,000 was appropriated and approved to establish the Fund.

Fiscal Year 2024, \$10,000,000 was appropriated to the Fund subject to County Council approval of projects recommended for funding.

Fiscal Year 2025, prior year's funding was released for approved projects following County Council approval.

Annual Report

The Howard County Department of Housing and Community Development is required to report Fund activities of the prior fiscal year to the Howard County Council and the Howard County Delegation to the General Assembly by December 1 of each year. While there were no expenditures that occurred in FY2023 or FY2024, funds were committed for specified projects during those fiscal years. This is the first annual report.

Patuxent Commons – New construction community with a mix of 76 affordable and market-rate units that will ensure diversity by setting aside 19 units (25% of total units) for people with disabilities. The remainder of the units will be made available to older adults and families.

Tenant-based rental assistance – The ARC of Howard County will provide tenant-based rental assistance to existing tenants with intellectual or developmental disabilities to maintain housing stability. The tenants are very low income and generally rely on government assistance such as social security income.

Acquisition of rental units – Bridges to Housing Stability will use the funds to leverage other funding and acquire 6 new units that will be leased at affordable rents to low- and moderate-income households working in Howard County.

Waverly Winds and Ranleagh Court – Enterprise Community Development is planning the demolition of the existing, obsolete, flat-and-townhouse units in these 2 communities in Columbia, and of the construction of new multi-story apartment buildings that have on-site amenities including on-site management, community rooms, fitness center and outdoor recreational areas in the high opportunity area of downtown Columbia.

Home Sharing - Bridges to Housing Stability proposed the development and launch of a pilot Home Sharing Program for Howard County homeowners and home seekers. The program would connect homeowners who have a spare room in their home with people who need a place to live at an affordable rent. It is also a strategy of the Age-Friendly Initiative in Howard County to help address isolation in older adult households.

Downpayment Assistance – Increase homeownership opportunities by providing downpayment assistance to 20 current Housing Choice Voucher tenants interested in buying their first home.

Affordable Homeownership Project – The County has set aside \$4 million in funding from the Housing Opportunities Trust Fund to support the creation of new affordable homeownership opportunities in Howard County. These homeownership opportunities could include partnerships with the Howard County Housing Commission.

Weatherization Program – The Community Action Council will use funding to assist households with energy efficiency improvements to their homes to reduce the utility cost burden for those households.

Rehabilitation of Rental Units – The ARC of Howard County will provide renovations for three houses so that the residents may live in safe, clean, and affordable housing.

Rehabilitation of Homeowner Units - Rebuilding Together will provide critical home repairs and age friendly modifications, allowing homeowners to remain in their homes safely.

Rental Subsidy Program for Older Adults - Howard County will secure a provider to develop and implement a rental assistance program to provide rental subsidy payments for up to 24 months on behalf of income-eligible households with at least 1 older adult 62 years or older.

Foreclosure Prevention – Howard County will administer a program to provide up to 6 months of mortgage assistance to income eligible homeowners that have experienced a one-time hardship, enabling them to bring mortgage accounts current and remain in their homes.

Housing Opportunities Trust <u>Fund Disbursements</u>

Following the report end date of 06/30/2024, the Department of Housing and Community Development disbursed funding for previously awarded projects. Of the \$3,000,000 awarded for FY2024, and the \$12,000,000 awarded for FY2025, \$2,318,206 and \$4,275,000 were disbursed respectively, totaling \$6,593,206 in HOTF funds disbursed to date.
