1 WHEREAS, the Downtown Columbia Plan, a General Plan Amendment considered and adopted by passage of Council Bill No. 58-2009 on February 1, 2010 (the "Plan"), envisioned a 2 full spectrum of affordable housing to make Downtown Columbia a model for smarter, more 3 4 livable communities; and 5 WHEREAS, the Plan called for the creation of a Downtown Columbia Housing 6 7 Foundation, and Council Bill No. 24-2012 legislatively established the Foundation, finding that it 8 was necessary to fulfill the vision of the Plan, ensuring that low-, moderate- and middle-income families have an opportunity to live in Downtown Columbia; and 9 10 WHEREAS, by passing Council Resolution No. 154-2012, the County Council 11 recognized the Columbia Downtown Housing Corporation as the Downtown Columbia Housing 12 Foundation, placing confidence in the experience, skill, capabilities and expertise of its directors; 13 14 and 15 WHEREAS, in its 2013 annual report, the newly created Columbia Downtown Housing 16 Corporation reported that it had identified challenges in carrying out its obligations; and 17 18 WHEREAS, in its 2014 annual report, citing continuing challenges in fulfilling its 19 20 mission, the Columbia Downtown Housing Corporation reported that modifications to the Plan are needed to be able to achieve affordable housing goals for Downtown Columbia and that it 21 would be difficult to realize affordable housing goals without legislative changes. 22 23 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Howard County, 24 Maryland, this <u>29</u>th day of <u>Octobe</u>, 2014, that the Council requests that the Columbia 25 Downtown Housing Corporation recommend legislative changes believed necessary and 26 appropriate, which may include amendments to either the General Plan, Zoning Regulations, or 27 County Code, to ensure that the Plan's vision for a full spectrum of affordable housing can be 28 1

19	the Council requests that the Columbia Downtown Housing Corporation submit its	
20	recommendations to the County Council and County Executive on or before March 1, 2015.

23	the Columbia Downtown Housing Corporation shall have staff support from the Howard County	
24	Department of Housing and Community Development and the Howard County Department of
