Presentations and Discussion:

Dr. Henry Cole, Who gave a presentation entitled, "Siting Recommendations for New, Large Gas Stations in Howard County, Maryland". Some of the recommendations and notable points that Dr. Cole made were:

- Buffers were needed for new large gas stations to minimize the effects and risks of air pollution on public health.
 - The buffer should be approximately 1,000 feet from hospitals, schools, daycares, and recreation sites.
 - Large gas stations are those that produce at least 3.6 million gallons per year.
 - Gasoline pollution produces Benzene vapor, which is major health risk.
- Buffers were needed for new large gas stations to protect natural resources.
 - There should be at least a 500 foot buffer from parks and woodlands, wells and reservoirs, and critical ground water areas.
